<p><i>Little Me . . . In My World</i> Ages 3-5</p>	<p>Our youngest artists will explore the world around them using paint, clay, monoprints, and more!</p> <p>Classes are offered in 4 week sessions throughout the year. Parent or guardian must attend class with each student.</p>
<p><i>Kids &amp; Clay</i> Ages 6-12</p>	<p>Light up your creativity and let your imagination come to life! Students in this class will make all sorts of creatures and critters while they explore the use of this hands-on medium.</p>
<p><i>Children's Art Classes</i> Ages 7-16</p>	<p>Be the best artist you can be! Our instructors will work with students to build a portfolio of their work, including animals, cartoons, portraits, landscapes, and more.</p>
<p><i>Creative Explosion</i> Ages 7-14</p>	<p>Explore new ways to express yourself, and release your creativity! Our instructors will introduce students to word art, reverse glass painting, and other creative projects to enhance their skills.</p>
