Youth Orchestras

The Osceola Arts Youth Orchestras (OAYO) are welcome to string players entering 3rd grade through 12th grade who have at least one year of school orchestra and/or private lesson experience. The Sinfonia and Philharmonic Orchestras also welcome wind players and percussionists with at least one year of school band and/or private lesson instruction. <p><i>Debut Orchestra</i> Beginner: Strings Only</p>	<p>This is a String Orchestra. String musicians with a minimum of one year of experience are welcome here.</p>
<p><i>Sinfonia Orchestra</i> Intermediate: Strings, Percussion, Winds</p>	<p>This is a Full Orchestra with strings, winds, and percussion. String players who are more advanced and wind players with a minimum of one year of experience can audition for this ensemble. This ensemble is comprised of mostly musicians in 6th-10th grade.</p>
<p><i>Philharmonic Orchestra</i> Advanced: Strings, Percussion, Winds</p>	<p>This is a Full Orchestra with strings, winds, and percussion. This is the most advanced OAYO ensemble, and is mostly comprised of experienced high school musicians.</p>
